

A Committee of the Whole session is generally held on the last Tuesday of each month at 7 p.m., except in July and August. Parents and residents are invited to attend all meetings. Meetings are listed in the calendar and announced in the local media.

District residents and others may reach the entire Board of Education with an email to [boe@nredlearn.org](mailto:boe@nredlearn.org), which will be forwarded to all Board members, the Superintendent of Schools, the Clerk and Secretary to the Board of Education and the Assistant to the Clerk and Secretary. The Board also provides time at its regular monthly meetings for the public to be heard. A School District resident who wishes to speak at a Board of Education meeting should contact the Clerk's office and indicate their intention to speak. Residents who wish to communicate with the Board by letter may address their communication to the President, Board of Education, 515 North Avenue, New Rochelle, NY, 10801.

Questions concerning administrative matters or individual students should not be directed to the Board until the appropriate staff members or administrators have first been contacted. In cases of questions or problems concerning a student, parents should first contact the teacher or guidance counselor, then the principal, and then, if necessary, the Superintendent of Schools or his staff.

If after these contacts are made, questions still remain, the matter may then be brought to the attention of the Board of Education. Experience has shown that most problems can be resolved with the least delay if the staff member nearest the problem is approached first.



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# Student Support Services

*The Student Support Services department is committed to the success of all students in an educational setting. The department maintains census records and attendance information and offers the services below.*

## SCHOOL PSYCHOLOGY

School psychologists provide important support to assist students in achieving maximal benefits from their educational programs. Their services include support for the prevention of educational and behavioral problems through 1) early consultation with school staff and parents; 2) identification of students' strengths and needs through observation; 3) psychological and other assessments; 4) individual and group counseling; 5) development and implementation of primary prevention; 6) social skills and esteem-building programs; 7) positive behavioral interventions; 8) parent education; and 9) crisis intervention and other services.

## SCHOOL SOCIAL WORK

School social workers are resources for the delivery of school-based support services and work as liaisons among the schools, families, and community programs and agencies. Emphasis is placed on collaboration and coordination of services. By utilizing social history and other assessments, social workers collaborate with parents, teachers, and other staff as part of a multidisciplinary team in interpreting children's needs.

## ATTENDANCE/TRUANCY

Attendance teachers are essential participants in the district's efforts toward attendance improvement and dropout prevention. They provide outreach, through home visits to students and families, to address attendance problems before they become chronic. They serve as liaisons with community agencies and Family Court. Through residency verification and investigations, attendance teachers help to ensure that the district's resources are reserved for New Rochelle residents.

## WORK PERMIT APPLICATIONS

Work permits are required by law for students under 18. Information about procedures and application forms is available from the school guidance office or from the census office located on the third floor of City Hall, 515 North Ave.

## CENSUS

A continuous census is maintained of resident minors enrolled in public and non-public schools inside and outside of the City of New Rochelle. Pupil population data includes individual and family information, essential for District projects. All working papers are issued by the Census Office.

## CHANGE OF ADDRESS OR PHONE

Any change of a student's personal status, such as a change of address (including apartment number), telephone number, or family name should be reported to the school office. Parents must also notify the school of changes in telephone numbers where they may be reached in cases of emergency. Personal information will be kept confidential.

## CENTRAL REGISTRATION OF NEW STUDENTS

Families interested in enrolling students can register online on our district website, [nred.org/page/registration](http://nred.org/page/registration). At the time of registration, parents must have three proofs of residency, proof of the student's age, and the most recent report card to upload at the end of their application. For students residing with someone other than a parent or court-appointed legal guardian, or in cases where parents do not have required proof of residency, enrollment must be arranged through the Student Support Services Department. Registration support is available at City Hall. Please call 576-4274 for information. Central Registration is open to assist families with registration by appointment only, Monday-Friday from 8:30 p.m. – 4:30 p.m. and on Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday from 4:30 p.m. – 6:00 p.m.

At the time of registration, students residing in the Lincoln attendance zone will be assigned a school by the office of Superintendent of Schools.

## HEALTH SERVICES

The Health Services Department is comprised of a team of experienced nurses, support staff, and a districtwide Medical Director. There are health offices in each of our school buildings that provide first aid and emergency care to students and staff. Our nurses are also an integral part of your child's health care team when medications or health conditions need management during the school day. Staff work collaboratively with all disciplines in the school system to ensure that your child reaps the benefit of good health and is able to participate safely and fully in all available programs. We advise all families to check with their health care providers before school starts to ensure that their children are up to date on their immunizations and health examinations, including annual renewal of medication orders for administration in school. Forms are available on our district website, under Health Services.

The Health Services Department oversees compliance with the New York State Public Health Law Section 2164, related to immunization requirements for school entry. In order to attend school, complete immunization records are required for all new students and updated immunization records are required for students promoted to the following grades:



grade 6 - Tdap booster, grade 7 - 1st dose of meningococcal vaccine, grade 12 - 2nd dose of meningococcal vaccine, given on or after age 16. Failure to provide acceptable evidence of immunization within 14 days of entry may lead to exclusion from school. The period may be extended up to 30 days for those transferring from out-of-state or from abroad.

As per New York State Education Law Article 19, a health examination certificate is mandated for students entering the school district and/or pre-K, K, 1st, 3rd, 5th, 7th, 9th, and 11th grade. The form is to be completed by a New York State licensed physician, physician assistant, or nurse practitioner. A copy of the health examination must be provided to the school nurse within 30 days. If a student is unable to obtain a form from their own provider, a school-designated provider may be assigned to perform a health examination for a mandated grade, interscholastic athletics participation, employment certifications, or upon request from the Special Education Department.

Medical clearance is required for all students interested in participating in interscholastic athletics. Online registration for sports is available through the athletic department website. Registration including completion of Athletic Health History and submission of an updated physical examination. Early registration permits school nurses to review student records and request additional medical documentation as necessary.

### CONFIDENTIALITY OF MEDICAL & MENTAL HEALTH INFORMATION

The clinical staff of the City School District of New Rochelle adheres to the standards of the Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act (HIPAA) to the extent that those standards are applicable to school districts. In addition, the confidentiality of student medical/health information in student records is protected by the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA).

### WELLNESS

The City School District of New Rochelle has a wellness policy and an active wellness program. The district Wellness Committee provides an access point for each building-level Wellness Committee to share ideas and collaborate on healthy initiatives throughout our school community. Families and staff are encouraged to become involved in school and districtwide wellness activities, starting with modeling healthy behaviors surrounding nutrition, physical activity, and emotional health.

### HEAD INJURY/CONCUSSION

The Health Services and Athletic Departments share responsibility for the District's Head Injury/Concussion Management program. Student-athletes participating in high-impact or contact sports undergo baseline IMPACT neurocognitive testing annually. In accordance with District policy and procedure, athletes who sustain head injuries/concussions must be removed from play, seen by a physician, repeat IMPACT testing, and complete the Normalization of Activity Protocol, with Medical Director approval, before returning to play. The school nurse should also be notified if your child sustains a head injury/concussion outside of the school environment.

# Transportation

## TRANSPORTATION

Free transportation is provided only for pupils enrolled in Kindergarten through Grade 5 who are New Rochelle residents who live at least 1.5 miles, but less than 10 miles, from the school they attend. Students in grades 6-12 who are eligible may purchase subsidized MetroCards or student passes to use for public transportation to and from school at a reduced cost. No trips home for lunch are provided.

Pre-Kindergarten children attending school for half-days at Henry Barnard School - morning or afternoon- are transported according to a regular bus schedule.

The district does not provide door-to-door transportation service, except for pupils enrolled in special education programs. Students in kindergarten and their siblings will be dropped off at their home address following the 3:15 p.m. dismissal; however, such services do not include buses or vans entering private driveways, roads, cul de sacs, or dead-end streets.

**Safety Reminders:** Parents should familiarize pupils with bus stop locations and ensure that pupils arrive at their bus stop at least 10 minutes prior to pick up. Pupils are transported to and from assigned bus stop locations only. Children in Grades 2 and over will be discharged at their assigned bus stops, even if there is no adult present to receive them, except for special education students. For students in Kindergarten, Grade 1 and Special Education, a parent, guardian, or other designee must be present for the student to be discharged. The safety of the pupil between home and the bus stop location is the responsibility of the parent.

Parents should stress the importance of remaining seated and reasonably quiet while the bus is in motion.

Students should dress for weather conditions and for visibility in inclement weather. Policies and procedures

and evacuation drills are in place to ensure your child's safety. Please support these safety measures.

To maintain discipline, the school district reserves the right to suspend transportation privileges. For more information, please visit our website at [www.nred.org](http://www.nred.org).

**Transportation Application Procedures:** To Private Schools: April 1 is the deadline to request free transportation for children in grades K-5 who attend private or parochial schools. Applications must be filed every year. Applications received after the April 1 deadline (or requests for change of school after April 1 on applications filed prior to April 1) will be approved only if additional expense is not incurred by the school district.

To a child care provider: Applications for children in grades K-5 to a child care provider are due April 1 and must be filed annually for every school year.

# Educational Programs

## PRE-KINDERGARTEN PROGRAMS

Early childhood education is of the utmost importance to the City School District. There are two types of Pre-Kindergarten programs available at Henry Barnard School.

There are limited four-year magnet spots and one-year Universal Pre-Kindergarten (UPK) spots. New Rochelle Collaborating Centers (Collaborators) also provide one-year UPK spots for a limited number of four-year-olds. They are located throughout the city. The magnet and UPK experience helps young children with a comfortable, secure, and inviting transition from home to school.

Pre-kindergarten provides developmentally appropriate opportunities to promote each child's natural abilities, interests, and enthusiasm for learning. Information regarding applying for and placement in the NYS Universal Pre-Kindergarten program or the Early Childhood Magnet Pre-Kindergarten program is available by contacting the Early Childhood Office at 914-576-4622.

Applications are available online starting January 8th. To be considered for the first round of placements, applications must be submitted by 4:30 p.m. on Friday, January 31, 2025.

## PERFORMING & VISUAL ARTS

A comprehensive performing and visual arts program provides students with rich experiences from Grades Pre-K-12. Resident performers and artists complement our arts education programs throughout our schools. The NRHS PAVE (Performing and Visual Arts Education) program provides talented high school students an opportunity to major in a specific art form (dance, music, theater, visual arts). Students are admitted by auditions held each spring. Our young artists present their accomplishments through concerts, recitals, and shows in the winter and spring. Our annual, districtwide "Our Children, Our Artists," visual arts exhibit at the New Rochelle Public Library each May showcases exemplary student artwork.

## MAGNET SCHOOLS: MAGNET APPLICATION

Applications for the Columbus Science, Math, Technology Magnet (C=SMT), the Daniel Webster Humanities Magnet, and Barnard Early Childhood Center (Grades K-2) are due by 4:30 pm on Friday, March 28, 2025. Information regarding applying for and placement for a Magnet Program are available by contacting the Magnet Office at 914-576-4622. Applications are available online starting March 5th.

## BARNARD EARLY CHILDHOOD CENTER

A dynamic and challenging primary Magnet Program for Pre-Kindergarten through Grade 2. The students engage in learning activities aligned to the Common Core State Standards in a socially and emotionally safe and nurturing environment where the focus is on the cognitive and social development of each child. Students who complete the program at Barnard will automatically

have a space reserved for them at their neighborhood elementary school for Grade 3.

## COLUMBUS SCIENCE, MATH, TECHNOLOGY MAGNET

The Magnet Program at Columbus School provides a challenging curriculum with an emphasis on science, math, and technology. School activities, as well as after-school programs such as our nationally competitive Chess Club, are organized to demonstrate that all students can meet and exceed the highest standards of excellence. The Columbus Magnet School ensures that classroom and school-wide activities meaningfully engage and excite students while also involving parents in their children's education. In addition to child-centered, hands-on science, technology, reading, research, and mathematics projects. Columbus emphasizes frequent use of technology throughout the school, with the hopes of expanding work in coding. Partnerships include Boys & Girls Club -New Rochelle-Mascaro Clubhouse and colleges and universities such as Iona, Pace, Teachers College Columbia University, and City College's Math in the City Program.

## DANIEL WEBSTER HUMANITIES MAGNET

Daniel Webster Magnet School enrolls children in Kindergarten through Grade 5. As part of the Magnet Program, there is a humanities theme at each grade level. The themes are Jurisprudence (laws and customs), Philosophy (logical reasoning and relationships), Economics (interdependence), Sociology (self/family, neighborhood), and Philosophical Perspectives through Literature. Spanish is taught at every grade level; Webster School also features a Studio Arts Program where children participate in performing arts or visual arts for 10 consecutive weeks.



## KALEIDOSCOPE

Kaleidoscope is an enrichment program of study in language arts and mathematics for all students in Grades 4-5, which is intended to complement the core curriculum. Students participate in the regular classroom program or are selected for either the modified Kaleidoscope program at each elementary school or the full-time Kaleidoscope at Webster Elementary School, which also includes science, social studies, and Mandarin. Selection is based on the test criteria, creativity ratings, and a review of writing samples.

## SPECIAL PROGRAMS

Special programs include Pre-Kindergarten programs for 4-year-olds, expansive K-12 technology education programs in all schools, a modified Kaleidoscope program in each K-5 building, a full-time districtwide Kaleidoscope program in Webster Elementary School, a unique space science curriculum featuring demonstrations in the New Rochelle High School planetarium, English as a second language programs (which enroll children from more than 20 countries) and infused arts-in-education programs. All these programs reflect the school district's ongoing commitment to expand learning horizons and to broaden educational perspectives. In addition, all elementary schools feature a unique thematic component as an overlay to the district's Common Core-aligned curriculum.

## ELEMENTARY LANGUAGE PROGRAMS

An expansive world languages program provides children with rich experiences in a variety of languages from grades K-12. Every elementary school in the district offers students language learning opportunities in at least one language – Spanish, Mandarin, or Italian – through one of the following program models: FLES (Foreign Language in the Elementary Schools), Intensive FLES, or Dual-Language. When necessary, there is a lottery for placement in the Spanish Dual Language Program, housed at Trinity and Ward. A robust Italian FLES Program is offered at Henry Barnard and Jefferson Elementary Schools. Students interested in the Italian FLES program at Jefferson, apply to Henry Barnard's Magnet Lottery as early as pre-school, as Barnard offers Italian FLES to its students in Grades K-2.

## SPECIAL EDUCATION

The Special Education Department offers comprehensive services for students with disabilities ages 3 to 21 who are recommended to receive special education by the Committee on Special Education (CSE) or Committee on Preschool Special Education (CPSE). The program provides individualized education in the least restrictive setting. The department provides advocacy and support and works with the Special Education Parent Teacher Association (SEPTA) programs.

Each September, the District seeks to identify children with disabilities who will enter the public schools and are not identified by the District's Committee on Special Education. Parents or guardians who believe their children may have a disability should contact the Office of Special Education, 515 North Ave, New Rochelle, NY 10801. ## ALTERNATIVE EDUCATION PROGRAMS

Huguenot Academy is a part of New Rochelle High School designed to provide students with a small supportive setting in which to pursue their high school diploma. The program offers high school students experiencing challenges in school an opportunity to apply for a "fresh start" in our alternative setting. Prospective students must demonstrate a strong motivation to enter the program.

The program provides the students with small classes, personalized attention, academic support, counseling support and a variety of instructional approaches. Our smaller learning environment also provides students with a greater sense of belonging to a community. Opportunities for community service and cultural enrichment are also provided as part of our program. We focus on helping students improve

their self-esteem and achieve success. The overwhelming majority of students who enroll will demonstrate improved attendance, grades, and credit accumulation, and will go on to earn a Regents diploma.

## EMERGENCY ANNOUNCEMENTS

If schools must be closed due to bad weather or other emergencies, or if significant transportation delays are experienced, announcements will be made over the following local media: school district web pages [www.nred.org](http://www.nred.org), robocalls, and text messages. If there is no announcement, schools are open. If schools are closed for in-person learning, they are closed for all other scheduled activities, including after-school programs, athletics, continued education classes, and evening programs.

As a decision is made, our primary concern is the safety of the children. Because the District may need to notify you by phone in an emergency, please provide your child's school with any change in telephone number or contact information.

## SCHOOL EMERGENCY INFORMATION GUIDE FOR PARENTS AND GUARDIANS

### *The Role of Parents in an Emergency*

In a school emergency, the first instinct as a parent is to call the school or rush to the school to get your child/children. The truth is that this only complicates matters from a safety and security standpoint.

Parents who are too close to an incident often hinder the rescue attempts of police, fire, and EMS officials on the scene. The best action parents can take in an emergency is to stay close to their phone and email and to monitor local radio and TV reports for regular updates and instructions.

### *How Can I Be Reunited with My Child?*

Parents/Guardians will be directed by school or public safety officials via robocall, email, and/or text messages to their child's specific location. Students will be released ONLY to parents/guardians who are documented as emergency contacts and who present a picture ID such as a driver's license, military ID, or passport. The reunification process can be time-consuming, so parents are urged to be patient.

In the event of an emergency at your child's school, it is important to know these terms:

**LOCKDOWN:** A lockdown takes place if an internal threat is identified at the school. All school doors are locked, and the students are confined to classrooms. No entry into or exit from the school will be allowed until an “all-clear” announcement is made. Students will NOT be released during a lockdown.

**LOCKOUT:** A lockout takes place if an external threat is identified at the school. All school doors are locked, and the students remain inside the building. No entry into or exit from the school will be allowed until an “all-clear” announcement is made. Students will NOT be released during a lockout.

**SHELTER-IN-PLACE:** Students take refuge in designated areas to protect them from hazardous materials or severe weather. No entry into or exit from school will be allowed until an “all-clear” announcement is made. Students will NOT be released during a shelter-in-place.

**EVACUATION:** In the event of certain building emergencies, students will be relocated to an evacuation assembly area. Students will be released ONLY to parents/guardians with picture ID and permission from a district official. This procedure is necessary to account for the whereabouts of all students.

## SCHOOL EMERGENCY RESPONSE PROTOCOLS

A school crisis can take a number of forms including an environmental event, such as a chemical spill or gas leak; a weather emergency, such as a tornado warning; or an intruder in or near the school. The nature of a school crisis dictates whether school officials will put in place lockdown, lockout, shelter-in-place, evacuation, or any combination of two of these protocols, to ensure the safety and well-being of students and staff. In the event of an emergency, the parents' staging area will be at City Hall in the City Council Chambers in order to receive further information and instructions.





## BE PREPARED FOR A SCHOOL EMERGENCY

Ensure that your child's emergency contact information is accurate and current.

The district uses robocalls, email, and/or text messages to notify parents of inclement weather and emergencies.

Become familiar with your school's emergency communication procedures. Each school is committed to providing accurate and timely information in the event of an emergency.

## IN CASE OF A SCHOOL EMERGENCY

Although your first reaction would be to call or rush to your child's school, please follow the tips listed below.

**DO** tune into local TV/Radio stations for official school news alerts.

**DO** rely only on official communication from school or public safety officials.

**DO** listen for official information regarding the location of reunification with your child. Make sure to have proper ID.

**DO NOT** call or rush to your child's school. Your presence could interfere with emergency responders.

**DO NOT** phone your child or school. Staff and students are discouraged from using cell phone communication for safety reasons.

## PESTICIDE NEIGHBOR NOTIFICATION FOR SCHOOLS

New York State Education Law Section 409-H, signed into law in July 2001, requires all public and nonpublic elementary and secondary schools to provide written notification to all persons in parental relations, faculty, and staff regarding the potential use of pesticides periodically throughout the school year. The school district is required to maintain a list of persons in parental relation, faculty, and staff who wish to receive 48-hour prior written notification of certain pesticide applications. The following pesticide applications are not subject to prior notification requirements:

- A school remains unoccupied for a continuous 72-hours following an application;
- Anti-microbial products;
- Nonvolatile rodenticides in tamper-resistant bait stations in areas inaccessible to children;
- Silica gel and other nonvolatile ready-to-use pastes, foams, or gels in areas inaccessible to children;
- Boric acid and disodium octaborate tetrahydrate;
- The application of EPA designated biopesticides;
- The application of EPA designated exempt materials under 40CFR152.25;
- The use of aerosol products with a directed spray in containers of 18 fluid ounces or less when used to protect individuals from an imminent threat from stinging and biting insects including venomous spiders, bees, wasps, and hornets.

In the event of an emergency application necessary to protect against an imminent threat to human health, a good faith effort will be made to supply written notification to those on the 48-hour prior notification list. ## REINSPECTION NOTICE - AHERA PROGRAM

Under the provisions of the Federal AHERA program and the New York State Education Department, all public school buildings must be inspected every three years and periodically checked every six months to update the district's asbestos management plans. New Rochelle's first inspection under AHERA was completed in 1989.

Re-inspections are conducted every three years, most recently in the summer of 2022.



# Annual Notification

## FAMILY EDUCATIONAL RIGHTS AND PRIVACY ACT PROTECTION OF PUPIL RIGHTS AMENDMENT

Dear Parents and Eligible Students<sup>1</sup>:

We are writing to advise you of your rights with respect to: (a) school records; (b) the administration and use of certain survey instruments; and (c) physical examinations and screenings. This notification is required by federal law.

### **A. Access to, Correction of and Release of Student Records (Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act)**

In accordance with the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act, the City School District of New Rochelle has adopted a Student Record Policy to assure that parents and eligible students have the right to access information contained in the student's records and to assure, further, that parents and eligible students can limit disclosure of certain information from these records. An eligible student is a student who is 18 years old or a legally emancipated minor, in which case the rights described in this notification are transferred from the parent to the student. The rights accorded to parents and eligible students under the School District's policy are set out below:

1. Parents and eligible students have the right to inspect and review the student's education records within 15 days of the day a request for access is made. Requests may be addressed to the Principal of the school the student currently attends, and the Principal will make arrangements for inspection at a specific time and place.
2. The School District will not release information contained in a student's education record without prior written consent of the parent or eligible student, except under those limited circumstances as permitted by the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act. The School District will release such information without prior notice or consent to school officials who have a legitimate educational interest in obtaining access to them in order to perform their professional responsibilities. In addition, the School District will forward education records (including student disciplinary records) without prior notice or consent in response to a request received from another school in which a student seeks to enroll.
3. The School District will also release "directory information" without prior written consent. "Directory information" is personally-identifiable information that would not be likely to invade the privacy of a parent or eligible student if disclosed. It includes the student's name and address, dates of attendance, participation in officially recognized activities and sports, diplomas and awards received, the present and the most recent previous educational institutions attended, and photographs or video depicting students at school activities or events. Such directory information may be released (among other forms of release) in school publications, and in media print, electronic and broadcast outlets. The release of "directory information" is subject to the following two limitations:
  - a. In no event will "directory information" be released if the School District determines that the information will be used for commercial or fundraising purposes.
  - b. You may notify the School District that you do not consent to the release of "directory information." To do so, please complete the attached Permission Opt-Out form and return it to the main office of your child's school by October 10, 2024. Your request will be effective through this academic year and must be renewed annually.
4. A parent or eligible student may ask the School District to correct (amend) any part of the student's education record which is believed to be inaccurate, misleading or in violation of the student's rights. Such requests should be addressed in the first instance in writing to the Principal of the school the student currently attends, should clearly identify the portion(s) of the record which is requested to be changed, and should specify why the record is believed to be inaccurate, misleading or in violation of the student's rights.

<sup>1</sup>An "eligible student" is a student or former student who has reached the age of eighteen or is attending a post-secondary school.

<sup>2</sup>A "school official" is a person employed by the School District as an administrator, supervisor, instructor, or support staff member; a person serving on the Board of Education; a person or entity with whom the School District has contracted to perform a special task (such as an attorney, auditor, medical consultant or therapist); a parent or student serving on an official committee (such as a disciplinary or grievance committee, or a Committee on Special Education); and a person assisting another school official in performing his or her responsibilities.



5. In case of disagreement with the School District as to the appropriateness of an education record as to which a correction has been requested, the parent or eligible student will be notified of the School District's decision and of the right to a request for a hearing by sending a written request to the School District addressed to Dr. Gail Joyner, Assistant Superintendent for Student Support Services, 515 North Avenue, New Rochelle, New York 10801. Upon receipt of such a request, the School District will furnish additional information regarding the hearing procedures.
6. A parent or eligible student may also file a complaint with the United States Department of Education if he or she believes that the School District has violated the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act with respect to his or her record. Complaints should be addressed as follows:

7. Please note that school systems periodically receive requests from the United States Armed Forces, pursuant to the "No Child Left Behind Act of 2001," for the names, addresses and telephone numbers of 11th and 12th grade students so that branches of the military can send students information about education, technical training and financial benefits available upon enlistment in the military. The School District will provide such information in response to such requests unless the parent or eligible student withholds consent to such release. To withhold consent, please complete the attached Permission Opt-Out form and return it to the main office of your child's school by October 10, 2024. Your request will be effective through this academic year and must be renewed annually. In addition, please be advised that the School District is required by law to give military recruiters the same access to secondary school students as is provided to postsecondary institutions and prospective employers.

## **B. Utilization of and Consent to Surveys and Examinations or Screenings Administered to Students (Protection of Pupil Rights Amendment)**

It is long-standing School District policy that questionnaires, surveys and physical examinations and/or screenings are not administered to students without prior notice to parents, and with an opportunity to parents and eligible students to grant or withhold consent to such administration. Notwithstanding, the School District is required by federal law to inform parents and eligible students about the requirements applicable to all public school systems with regard to such activities, and also with respect to certain physical examinations and/or screenings.

1. Parents and eligible students are entitled to notice and the opportunity either to consent or "opt out" of any survey (and, upon request to inspect any such survey instrument) of participation by a student in a which includes any of the following eight areas of "protected information":
  - The political affiliations or beliefs of the student or the student's parent(s);
  - Mental or psychological problems of the student or of the student's family;
  - Sex behavior or attitudes;
  - Illegal, anti-social, self-incriminating or demeaning behavior;
  - Critical appraisals of others with whom survey subjects have close family relationships;
  - Legally-recognized privileged relationships, such as with lawyers, doctors or religious leaders (ministers, rabbis, priests, imams, and similar persons);
  - The religious practices, affiliations or beliefs of the student or the student's parent(s); and
  - Income information, other than as may be required to determine eligibility for a School District or other public program.

<sup>3</sup>If the survey is funded in whole or in part by the United States Department of Education, then consent must be obtained before a student is required to submit to a survey. Even if the survey is not so funded, notice of the survey and an opportunity to opt out of participation must be provided.

<sup>4</sup>Federal law makes a distinction between surveys of "protected information" which are funded in whole or in part by the United States Department of Education (in which case the prior consent of parents and eligible students must be obtained) and surveys of "protected information" which are funded from other sources (in which case an "opt-out" opportunity must be provided).

2. Parents and eligible students have the rights (a) to inspect upon request, and (b) to “opt out” of participation by a student in a survey which collects “personal information” (including such items as a student’s or parent’s first and last name, address, telephone number or Social Security number), if such information will be used for marketing or selling the information so collected, or will be provided to others for that purpose. However, these inspection and “opt-out” rights do not apply to the collection, disclosure or use of “personal information” from students for the exclusive purpose of developing, evaluating or providing educational products or services for or to students or educational institutions.
3. Parents and eligible students have the rights (a) to be notified of, and (b) to “opt out” of any non-emergency, invasive physical examination or screening which is: (i) required as a condition of school attendance, (ii) administered by a public school and scheduled by the school in advance, and (iii) is not necessary to protect the immediate health and safety of the student, or of other students. However, this “opt-out” right does not apply to physical examinations or screenings which are required or permitted by New York State law, such as mandatory vaccinations and regular physical examinations of students.
4. Parents and eligible students are entitled to inspect, upon request and before administration or use, (a) protected information surveys of students; (b) instruments used to collect personal information from students for marketing, sales, or other distribution purposes as described above; and (c) instructional material used as part of the educational curriculum.
5. A parent or eligible student may also file a complaint with the United States Department of Education if he or she believes that the School District has violated the Protection of Pupil Rights Amendment with respect to him or her. Complaints should be addressed as follows:

<sup>5</sup>This exception includes the following types of uses: disclosure to colleges, post-secondary educational institutions and military recruiters; book clubs, magazines and programs providing access to low-cost literacy products; curriculum and instructional materials used by elementary or secondary schools; tests and assessments used by elementary or secondary schools to provide cognitive, evaluative, diagnostic, clinical, aptitude or achievement information about students; the sale by students or products or services to raise funds for school-related or education-related activities; and student recognition programs.
