DISTRICT INFORMATION

SMOKING PROHIBITED

In accordance with federal, county and school guidelines, there is to be no smoking by anyone in school buildings. Further, smoking is prohibited on school buses. The general public is also prohibited from smoking in all school buildings at any time.

WORKING PERMITS

The school district cooperates with the New York State Labor Department in the issuance of working permits required by law for students under the age of 18 who seek employment. All public and nonpublic school children residing in the district who need such papers may obtain them by contacting the High School Guidance Office at 870-0466 before or after school hours.

To secure working papers a student must do the following:

- 1. Obtain and complete an application.
- 2. Be examined either by the school doctor or family physician.
- 3. Submit proof of age. (This can be in the form of a birth certificate, baptismal certificate or hospital record.)

STUDENT BICYCLES AND CARS - PARKING

Students may ride bicycles to and from school but not on school grounds. Bicycles are to be parked in designated parking areas. Students who park their bicycles or cars on school grounds do so at their own risk. High School pupils who wish to drive cars to school must comply with the following rules.

- 1. Vehicles must be registered with the building administration.
- 2. Cars must be driven carefully and in accordance with all signs and traffic directions on the school grounds.
- 3. No stopping or parking is permitted except in the areas designated for parking.
- 4. Students may not use cars between arrival and departure time except with special permission from the principal.
- 5. Students may not sit or study in parked cars.

CENTRAL REGISTRATION

The Central Registration Office is located at Wyandanch Memorial High School. Registration takes place on Monday through Wednesday, 8:30 AM-3:30 PM. ASBESTOS MANAGEMENT PLAN

The Wyandanch School District has complied with the Asbestos Hazard Emergency Act, AHERA [40 cfr 763.85 (E) (B)] by completing the following requirements.

EMERGENCY SCHOOL CLOSINGS

On occasions when school must be closed as the result of unusual weather conditions, announcements will be made in a variety of ways. DELAYED OPENINGS

Should the opening of schools be delayed for one or more hours in the morning, follow the steps under Emergency School Closing to confirm if school will be delayed. Breakfast in all schools will be canceled.

Transportation schedules will be modified, consistent with the length of the delay (i.e., if the delay is two hours, students scheduled for 7:30 AM pickups will be picked up at 9:30 AM.)

The school day will end at its regularly scheduled time.

TELEPHONE ALERT SYSTEM

The District utilizes a telephone alert called ParentSquare. The system enables the district to automatically send prerecorded phone messages to all Wyandanch School District parents in a matter of minutes. It is commonly used to get important messages to parents in a timely manner, such as a school closure or school emergency. Please update your phone/email and/or emergency contact information in the main office of your child's school.

TEXTBOOKS FOR NON-PUBLIC SCHOOL PUPILS

The purchase of textbooks and the loan of them to nonpublic school pupils is prescribed by Section 701 of the Education Law. Under this section, the Legislature currently provides \$58.25 per pupil annually for each nonpublic school pupil.

BOARD OF EDUCATION

The Wyandanch School District Board of Education consists of seven members elected for a threeyear term by the qualified voters of the District. The Superintendent is a nonvoting member of the Board. The Board of Education is the official legislative body responsible for the policies which govern the education of the children of Wyandanch.

Work sessions and voting sessions of the Board of Education are held on the second and third Wednesday of each month. Advance notice of special meetings and emergency meetings are provided to the community.

All Board Meetings are open to the public (except executive sessions), and time is always allotted for questions and comments from community members.

NOTICE OF NONDISCRIMINATION

A school's Title IX obligations to ensure nondiscrimination on the basis of sex requires schools to provide transgender students will equal educational programs and activities even in circumstances in which other students, parents or community members raise objections or concerns. Discrimination against transgender students based on their transgender status is a form of sex discrimination for purposes of Title IX.

The Guidance states that such obligations include but are not limited to: (1) providing a safe and nondiscriminatory environment for all students, including transgender; (2) using pronouns and names consistent with a transgender student's gender identity irrespective of whether the student's records have been changed accordingly; (3) allowing transgender students to access sex-segregated facilities (including bathrooms and locker rooms) and participate in sex-segregated activities consistent with their gender identity; (4) protecting students' privacy related to their transgender status, including their birth name and sex assigned at birth and prevent the nonconsensual disclosure of same. The Guidance provides that schools may "make individual-user options available to all students who voluntarily seek additional privacy." However, the Guidance advises that schools may not force transgender students to use individual-user options when other students are not required to do SO.

DISTRICT INFORMATION

PRIVATE/PAROCHIAL SCHOOL TRANSPORTATION

Transportation requests for September 2024 should be submitted to the Central Registration Office, 54 S. 32nd Street, Wyandanch, New York, 11798 (870-0513) no later than April 1, 2024, to allow adequate district transportation planning.

RELIGIOUS INSTRUCTION

According to NYSED Commissioner's Regulations Sec.109.2 students may be released from school for one hour one day a week to attend religious education. The instruction must be provided by an organized religious group. Parents must submit a written request by them and a representative of the religious group.

DISPLAY OF THE UNITED STATES FLAG

A United States flag shall be displayed at each school during business hours except in case of severe inclement weather. Also, a United States flag shall be displayed in the auditorium of the school during assemblies.

VISITORS

All visitors to our schools must first SIGN IN at the Security Desk or Main Office. This requirement is for safety purposes and to prevent the interruption of classes and to stop unauthorized individuals from entering the buildings. Government-issued I.D. is required at all buildings.

CHILD ABUSE AND NEGLECT

All school officials, including administrators, teachers, teacher assistants, coaches, registered nurses, doctors, psychologists or psychiatrists, and all other employees who are required to hold a teaching or administrative license or certificate from the State Education Department are mandated reporters. Suspected cases of child abuse and neglect will be reported to the NYS Central Registry.

ABSENCE AND ATTENDANCE

For students to be successful in school they need to attend regularly. Poor attendance has serious implications for academic failure. An absence, tardiness or early departure may be excused if due to personal illness, illness or death in the family, impassable roads due to inclement weather, religious observance, quarantine, required court appearances, attendance at health clinics, approved college visits, approved cooperative work programs, military obligations or other such reasons. An absence, tardiness or early departure is considered unexcused if the reason does not fall into previous categories (e.g., family vacations, babysitting, road test, oversleeping, working, etc.). Parents are encouraged to contact the school social worker or their child's school counselor if assistance is needed in this area.

USE OF SCHOOL FACILITIES

Qualified nonprofit organizations whose members comprise at least one-half district residents may be granted the use of school facilities. In some cases, custodial fees are required to be paid. An application form must be filed in the office of the Business Administrator (870-0420) at least two months prior to the date on which a facility is needed. A liability insurance certificate must accompany a use of facilities request. No use of facilities may be permitted unless a permit is issued.

SENIOR CITIZEN PRIVILEGES

Tax Exemptions: Partial tax exemptions for older persons will be granted with the proper application and the meeting of eligibility standards. Applications must be filed each year on or before March 1.

- 1. All owners must be 65 years old or if the owners are husband and wife, one must be 65 or older.
- 2. All owners must reside on the premises.
- 3. Property must be the legal residence of all owners.
- 4. All owners must be recorded owners for 24 consecutive months.
- 5. Combined income of all owners (or spouse) cannot exceed the maximum allowed by law (\$24,000 or less to \$32,400 on a sliding-scale basis).
- 6. This does not apply to vacant land.

Residents of the Wyandanch UFSD who are 60 years or older will be granted free admission to school-sponsored plays and shows and to intramural and interscholastic sports events. A Suffolk County Senior Citizen status may be used for admission.

Senior citizens 65 years old or older are also entitled to free tuition in the Wyandanch Adult Education programs and classes.

HOME INSTRUCTION

The Wyandanch UFSD provides home instruction based on a recommendation from a physician or from the Committee on Special Education. The school district's physician may be consulted to review medical requests for home instruction. Requests for home instruction may be made to the school principal.

DISTRICT INFORMATION

ANNUAL PUBLIC ANNOUNCEMENT

The Wyandanch UFSD continues as a Community Eligibility Provision School (CEP) for the 2023-24 school year.

This means that all students are eligible for a free breakfast and lunch regardless of economic situation. The meals served as part of this program meet the USDA guidelines.

Title 45 Regulation

"Unless objection to any of the specific following items of information is submitted in writing by parents or legal guardians or by those students themselves who are over the age of 18 years, the Wyandanch School District herewith gives notice of intention to provide, release or publish in the newsletters, school or student newspapers, magazines, yearbooks or other publications, daily or weekly newspapers, athletic programs, news releases any or all of the following information pertaining to students as may be appropriate under the circumstances: name of student, names of parents, address, age, height, weight, grade, major field of study, participation in recognized school activities, extracurricular activities and sports programs, academic honors, achievements, awards, scholarships, and similar information under Title 45. Parents who do not desire release of any of the above directory information must make specific requests to the Superintendent of Schools on or before October 1 of each school year. Failure to make such a request shall be deemed consent to release, provide or publish the directory information."

Release of Directory Information to the Military

Per regulations of the No Child Left Behind Act, parents, guardians or students over the age of 18 who do not desire the release of directory information to the military must make a specific request in writing to the superintendent of schools by Oct. 31, 2023. Failure to make such a request shall be deemed consent to release, provide or publish the directory information during the 2023-2024 school year.

Students can apply to multiple colleges of their choice through various online platforms. Colleges no longer accept paper applications.

• The Common App (www.commonapp.org) can be used to apply to over 700 colleges/universities nationwide.

• The SUNY application system (State University of New York) at www.suny.edu can be used to apply to SUNY schools in New York.

• The CUNY application system (City University of New York) at www.cuny.edu can be used to apply to schools within the five boroughs.

The Common Black College App

(www.commonblackcollegeapp.com) allows students to apply to historically Black colleges and universities.

• These various application systems allow students to apply to multiple schools at one time.

• Seniors are reminded to submit a completed activities resume to their school counselor in September.

• There will be opportunities to attend financial aid workshops throughout the fall semester for assistance in applying for the FAFSA.

• Scholarships are also available throughout the spring semester to apply for money for college.

This year we will be using Naviance to empower students and their families to connect academic achievement to their postsecondary goals. Naviance can be utilized to assist in the search for colleges and career options, monitor test scores and track progress toward meeting goals. Naviance can be reached through student Clever accounts.

2023–24 SCHOOL YEAR ELEMENTARY- AND INTERMEDIATE-LEVEL TESTING SCHEDULE

In the June 2022 statewide implementation of Computer-Based Testing memorandum, the New York State Education Department set forth details regarding plans to fully transition to computer-based testing (CBT) for the grades 3–8 English Language Arts (ELA) and Mathematics Tests and the Elementary-level (grade 5) and Intermediate-level (grade 8) Science Tests. In Spring 2024, all students in grades 5 and 8 will be required to take ELA, mathematics, and science Tests via CBT. The other grade levels may also participate in CBT, but paper-based testing will still be available for these students.

One of the benefits that comes with the implementation of computer-based testing is greater flexibility with the testing schedule. For the 2023–24 school year, there will be a singular multiple-week window to administer the grades 3–8 ELA and Mathematics Computer-based Tests and the grades 5 & 8 Science Computer-based Tests. The expanded computer-based testing window also provides greater flexibility to schools that do not wish to test during the April 8 solar eclipse and those that may close for the observance of Eid al-Fitr. Schools that are offering only paper-based tests for grades 3, 4, 6, and/or 7 and are closed on Wednesday, April 10 in recognition of Eid al-Fitr may use Monday, April 5 as an administration date for these exams.

Spring 2024 will also be the first administration of the new grade 5 and grade 8 Science Tests aligned to the NYS P-12 Science Learning Standards. Additional information on the new science tests is available on the Office of State Assessment's website.

For both paper-based and computer-based ELA and mathematics testing, schools will select two consecutive days within the respective administration windows to administer assessments for each grade level and subject. Schools must test the entire grade on the same two consecutive school days for each subject. For science, the entire grade must test on the same day. These rules are school-specific and need not be observed as district-specific. Schools with students in a CBT grade that must test on paper per an Individualized Education Program (IEP) or Section 504 Accommodation Plan, or because they require an alternate language edition of the mathematics or science test that is not available on computer, should test on the same days as their CBT grade cohorts. The New York State Department of Education reserves the right to change the dates.
